SUMMARY: (U) THIS REPORT FORWARDS INFORMATION ON COLOMBIAN DOMESTIC, AND COLOMBIAN RELATED ANTINARCOTICS ACTIVITIES FOR THE PERIOD 881101 THROUGH 881130.

TEXT: 1. (U) THE FOLLOWING IS A SUMMARY OF DOMESTIC ANTI-NARCOTICS ACTIVITIES FOR THE MONTH NOVEMBER 1988 --

- A. (U) 881101 - WESTERN BOYACA - ELEMENTS OF THE FIRST BRIGADE, COLOMBIAN ARMY (COLAR), SEIZED AND DESTROYED AT LEAST 30 HECTARES OF COCA PLANTS AND ARRESTED FOUR TO SIX PEOPLE. THE IDENTIFICATION OF THOSE ARRESTED IS UNKNOWN.
- B. (U) 881102 - MEDELLIN/ [REDACTED] - AUTHORITIES HAVE IDENTIFIED THE FOUR VICTIMS OF RECENT NARCO-RELATED KILLINGS -- JAIRO LEON ((PEREZ)) (23 YEARS), NAZARENO VALENCIA ((FERNANDEZ)) (27 YEARS), ROBERTO ((N)) (24 YEARS), AND GERMAN ((BERMUDEZ)) CASTILLO (AGE UNKNOWN). THE FIRST THREE BODIES WERE FOUND WITH A NOTE SAYING "FOR COOPERATING WITH THE CARTEL OF CALI". BERMUDEZ IS IDENTIFIED AS A LIEUTENANT IN THE CHOCO DEPARTMENT POLICE.
- C. (U) 881108 - BARRANQUILLA/ [REDACTED] - 25 KILOS OF COCAINE WERE DISCOVERED IN THE ALMADECO WAREHOUSE, READY FOR TRANSPORT TO THE U.S. IN A CARGO CONTAINER. THE COCAINE WAS DISCOVERED IN THE DOOR STRENGTHENERS AND FLOORING OF THE CONTAINER, COVERED WITH A PASTE MADE OF COFFEE AND MOTOR OIL IN HOPES OF CONCEALING THE ODOR. NO ARRESTS WERE MADE BY THE POLICE.
- D. (U) 881114 - ROVIRA/ [REDACTED] - COLOMBIAN NATIONAL POLICE DESTROYED 325 THOUSAND POPPY PLANTS, AND ARRESTED EIGHT COLOMBIANS ON THREE DIFFERENT FARMS IN THE REGION. THE THREE FARMS ARE OWNED BY RELATIVES OF THE BONILLA FAMILY - JUAN MARIA ((BONILLA)) MARIN, RAIMUNDO ((BONILLA)), AND LEONARDO ((BONILLA)) (RELATIONSHIP UNKNOWN). ARRESTED WERE GERMAN ANTONIO ((BONILLA)), WILSON ((MARIN)) RODRIGUEZ, LUIS ENRIQUE ((MARIN)) ALVAREZ, ARMANDO ((CESPEDES)) MARIN, JOSE ALBEIRTO ((BERMUDEZ)) BONILLA, BENILDA ((BONILLA)) MARIN, LEONARDO ((BONILLA)), AND JUAN MARIA ((BONILLA)) MARIN.
- E. (U) 881123 - FLORIDA/ [REDACTED] - SEVEN

TONS OF MARIJUANA IN 290 BALES WERE SEIZED BY POLICE ON THE FARM MARGARITA. TWO BALES OF SEEDS WERE ALSO SEIZED. ALTHOUGH FOUR ARRESTS WERE REPORTED, NAMES WERE NOT DIVULGED.

- F. (U) 881127 - SAN ANDRES/ [REDACTED] - AVIANCA AIRCRAFT N-202-AV WAS DETAINED AFTER NATIONAL POLICE DISCOVERED ONE KILO OF COCAINE HIDDEN IN SANITARY NAPKINS DEPOSITED IN A TRASHCAN ABOARD. THERE WERE NO ARRESTS.

- G. (U) 881130 - SAN JOSE DE GUAVIARE [REDACTED] - THREE ARRESTS WERE MADE AND ASSORTED PRECURSOR CHEMICALS WERE SEIZED BY NATIONAL POLICE DURING A RAID ON A FARM, VILLANUEVA, IN THE VAUPES DISTRICT. ARRESTED WERE GONZALO ((MORENO)) ORTEGA, JOSE HUMBERTO ((ANTONIO)), AND ISRAEL ((JIMENEZ)) RODRIGUEZ. SEIZED WERE 2,085 GALLONS OF AMMONIA, 700 GALLONS OF SULFURIC ACID, 7.6 KILOS OF POTASIUUM PERMANGANATE, 1,100 GALLONS OF GASOLINE, AND 20 BAGS OF CEMENT. 150 GRAMS OF COCA BASE AND 80 BUNCHES OF COCA LEAVES WERE ALSO SEIZED.

- H. (U) 881129 - VILLAVICENCIO/ [REDACTED] - THE COMMANDER OF THE SEVENTH BRIGADE, BG HAROLD ((BEDOYA)) PIZARRO,

ANNOUNCED THE SUSPENSION OF THE COMERCIAL PILOT'S LICENCE OF LUIS ((GUEVARA)) GUTIERREZ AS A RESULT OF HIS COMMANDING AN AIRCRAFT CARRYING COCA BASE AND RESTRICTED MUNITIONS ON 880123. THE CESSNA 20 CENTURION, JK-2897P, WITH GUEVARA COMMANDING WAS INSPECTED AT BARRANQUILLITA/ [REDACTED] /, AND THE CONTRABAND FOUND.

2. (U) THIS IS A SUMMARY OF FOREIGN ANTINARCOTICS ACTIVITIES INVOLVING COLOMBIAN NATIONALS --

- A. (U) 881102 - SONORA, MEXICO - 45 KILOS OF COCAINE WERE SEIZED, AND SIX ARRESTS (FIVE OF THEM COLOMBIAN NATIONALS) WERE MADE IN PUERTO LIBERTAD, SONORA BY SONORA JUDICIAL POLICE. ALSO CAPTURED WAS AN AIRCRAFT PRESUMABLY USED BY THE NARCOS.

- B. (U) 881102 - CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO - 4.8 TONS OF COCAINE WERE DISCOVERED BY MEXICAN MILITARY FORCES IN A CAVE IN THE NORTHERN MEXICAN STATE. THIS SEIZURE IS SAID TO BE THE LARGEST YET RECORDED WORLDWIDE. ALTHOUGH THERE WAS NO INDICATION AS TO THE EXACT ORIGIN, AUTHORITIES ARE POSITIVE IT ORIGINATED IN COLOMBIA.

- C. (U) 881103 - LA CORUNA, SPAIN - 50 KILOS OF COCAINE PACKED IN SHIPPING CONTAINERS AND MARKED "WS-10" AND "AR-30" WERE SEIZED BY PORT POLICE. TWO COLOMBIANS WERE ARRESTED - JORGE ALBERTO ((RODRIGUEZ)) AND HILDEBRANDO ((GALLEGO)). SPANISH AUTHORITIES ARE REPORTED TO HAVE INTENSIFIED INSPECTIONS OF INBOUND COLOMBIAN FLAG SHIPS.

- D. (U) 881110 - MILAN, ITALY - FOUR KILOS OF COCAINE HIDDEN IN BOXES OF CANDY WERE DISCOVERED BY ITALIAN CUSTOMS AGENTS DURING A LUGGAGE SEARCH AT MILAN AIRPORT. ARRESTED WERE CARLOS

((SANCHEZ)) SALAZAR (31 YEARS) AND SANDRA MARIA ((GARCIA)) (30 YEARS), NEW YORK CITY RESIDENTS, AFTER THEIR ARRIVAL ON A FLIGHT FROM NEW YORK TO MILAN.

- E. (U) 881016 - SAN MARTIN DEPARTMENT, PERU - THE SENDERO LUMINOSO HAS REPORTEDLY KILLED 13 COLOMBIAN NARCOTRAFFICKERS IN THE JUNGLE AREA OF RIO HUALLAGA. THE KILLINGS ARE SAID TO BE MOTIVATED BY REVENGE FOR THE ATTACK BY NARCOTRAFFICKERS ON TEN SENDEROS ON THE PERUVIAN SIDE OF THE PUTUMAYO RIVER BORDER. THE SENDEROS WERE APPARENTLY FORCING THE COUNTRY PEOPLE WORKING FOR THE NARCOS TO WORK FOR THE SENDERO LUMINOSO/M-19. SOURCES QUOTED THAT THE REPRISAL ATTACK CONSISTED OF AT LEAST 100 SENDERO ATTACKERS WITH EXPLOSIVES AND SMALL ARMS ON THE NARCO STRONGHOLDS IN THE PERUVIAN JUNGLES. THE BODIES OF THE NARCOS FOUND INDICATE TORTURE PRIOR TO EXECUTION. NO NAMES HAVE BEEN RELEASED, BUT ALIASES WERE NOTED "EL TIGRE", "PISCIS", AND "BUQUE".
