EVIDENCE OF DISRUPTIVE ACTIVITIES ON THE CAMPAIGN TRAIL INCLUDES ROADBLOCKS, ROCK THROWING, POWER OUTAGES, AND AN UNSCHEDULED PERFORMANCE BY A POLICE MARCHING BAND DURING A SPEECH BY CASTANEDA.

(C) FORMER ARMY COMMANDER AND PRESIDENT MORALES BERMUDEZ (1975-80) RESURFACED CONCERNS ABOUT FUJIMORI'S RELIANCE ON MILITARY SUPPORT BY PUBLICLY CRITICIZING MONTESINOS THIS MONTH FOR FAVORING CLASSMATES AND RELATIVES IN THE RECENT ROUND OF ARMY PROMOTIONS. OF 12 KEY ARMY COMMAND POSTS, NINE ARE HELD BY MONTESINOS'S FORMER CLASSMATES AND ONE BY HIS BROTHER-IN-LAW. MORALE IS ERODING AMONG ARMY OFFICERS WHO DO NOT BENEFIT FROM PATRONAGE AND IN THE LOWER RANKS OVER FUJIMORI'S IMPASSIONED DEFENSE OF MONTESINOS IN THE FACE OF MORALES'S CRITICISM.
- 11. (C) UNIFIED OPPOSITION? FUJIMORI MAY BE INDULGING IN OVERKILL--CASTANEDA AND ANDRADE ARE SEEN AS LACKLUSTER CANDIDATES WITHOUT STRONG AGENDAS. RECENT POLLS SHOW BOTH RUNNING UNDER 20 PERCENT, WITH FUJIMORI AT AROUND 40 PERCENT. FUJIMORI'S CHALLENGERS HAVE AVOIDED ATTACKING EACH OTHER, SAVING THEIR HARSHEST CRITICISM FOR THE PRESIDENT.
- 12. (C) RALLYING AROUND A SINGLE OPPOSITION CANDIDATE WILL BE NECESSARY, THOUGH PERHAPS NOT SUFFICIENT, TO DEFEAT FUJIMORI. A COALITION OF 14 OPPOSITION PARTIES SIGNED A STATEMENT THIS MONTH IN AN EFFORT TO AROUSE VOTER INTEREST IN POST-FUJIMORI DEMOCRATIC REFORMS. PUBLIC STATEMENTS

SUGGEST THAT IF EITHER ANDRADE OR CASTANEDA ESTABLISHES A CLEAR LEAD, THE OTHER WILL DROP OUT TO UNIFY THE OPPOSITION.
