4. IN HIS REMARKS TO THE PRESIDENT, GENERAL JOULWAN:

-- CONGRATULATED PRESIDENT FUJIMORI ON HIS STEPS TOWARD DEMOCRATIZATION AND HUMAN RIGHTS OVER THE LAST SIX MONTHS, AND ON THE ON THE GOOD PROGRESS PERU HAS MADE IN COUNTER-NARCOTICS EFFORTS.

-- EMPHASIZED, SEVERAL TIMES, THE IMPORTANCE OF A COORDINATED, COOPERATIVE REGIONAL EFFORT IN THE ANTI-DRUG STRUGGLE. DRUG TRAFFICKERS, HE STRESSED, DO NOT RESPECT NATIONAL BORDERS. THEY ARE CLEVER, ACTIVE AND RESOURCEFUL, PARTICULARLY AT EXPLOITING ANY WEAK LINK IN INDIVIDUAL NATIONAL EFFORTS.

-- NOTED HE ALWAYS PREFERRED TO LOOK TO FUTURE JOINT COOPERATION RATHER THAN LIVE IN THE PAST. HE SAID HE WOULD LOOK FOR WAYS IN THE COMING MONTHS TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE FOR PERU.

-- OBSERVED THAT NOT ONLY WAS PERU THE SOURCE OF 60-70 PERCENT OF THE WORLD'S COCA PRODUCTION, BUT THAT PERU'S GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION PUT IT IN THE KEY CENTRAL LOCATION IN SOUTH AMERICAN DRUG TRAFFICKING PATTERNS.

7. NEVERTHELESS, FUJIMORI ADMITTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN LITTLE NET POSITIVE IMPACT IN ANTI-DRUG EFFORTS OVER THE LAST 10 YEARS, AND THAT PERUVIAN COCA PRODUCTION IN 1990-91 WOULD BE STABLE.

8. EXPANDING ON THIS THEME, PRESIDENT FUJIMORI:

-- EXPLAINED THAT HIS PROGRAM TO "OPTIMIZE" BI-LATERAL RELATIONS WITH ECUADOR AND BOLIVIA AND CHILE WAS NOT JUST A CONCEPT OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS BUT AN ESSENTIAL ELEMENT OF HIS PLAN TO REDUCE OVERALL MILITARY EXPENDITURES AND BE ABLE TO CONCENTRATE REMAINING ASSETS ON ANTI-TERRORIST EFFORTS.

-- DECLARED THAT "PACIFICATION" (THE FIGHT AGAINST TERRORISM) WAS THE OVERARCHING GOAL OF ALL OF HIS POLICIES AND ACTIONS. WITHOUT SUCCESS IN PACIFICATION, HE SAID, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS WOULD BE FOR NAUGHT.

-- AGREED THAT FIGHTING DRUGS WAS AN IMPORTANT [REDACTED]

9. TURNING TO THE BI-LATERAL RELATIONS, PRESIDENT FUJIMORI DEFENDED HIS APRIL 5 COUP. HE DECLARED THAT PERU'S JUDICIAL SYSTEM NEEDS TOTAL REFORM BECAUSE IT WAS "TOTALLY CORRUPT" AND PEOPLE HAD NO FAITH IN IT. SINCE APRIL 5, HOWEVER, HE SAID THAT 95 PERCENT OF THE SENDERO LUMINOSO LEADERSHIP HAS BEEN ARRESTED, TRIED, CONVICTED, AND SENTENCED. FUJIMORI ALSO OBSERVED THAT GIVEN PERU'S STATUS AS A SOURCE OF 60-70 PERCENT OF THE WORLD'S COCA PRODUCTION, IT WAS IN THE LARGER STRATEGIC INTEREST OF THE UNITED STATES TO ASSIST US IN COMBATTING THIS "REGARDLESS OF THE EVENTS OF APRIL 5."

-- AGREED ON THE NEED FOR A REGIONAL STRATEGY. OF WHAT IMPORTANCE WAS IT WHEN INDIVIDUAL SHIPMENTS WERE INTERDICTED, HE ASKED RHETORICALLY, IF THE OVERALL PRODUCTION,

HE POINTED OUT TO THE PRESIDENT THAT U.S. ASSISTANCE IS LIKELY TO BE FROZEN UNTIL THE PROBLEM IS RESOLVED. 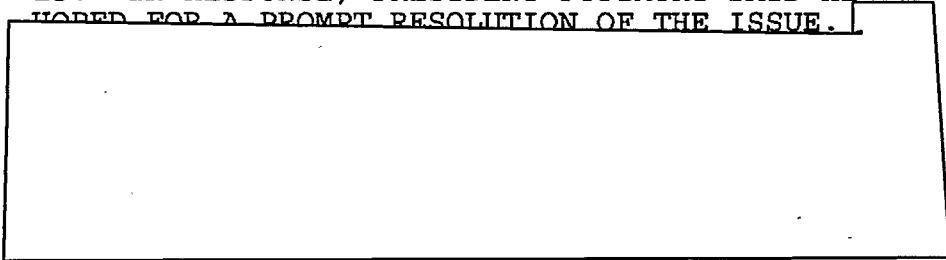

16. PRESIDENT FUJIMORI DEFENDED HIS PRISON REFORMS, SAYING THAT AFTER 12 YEARS OF NEGLECT HE HAD RE-TAKEN CONTROL OF THE PRISONS FROM THE SENDERO OVER THE PAST 18 MONTHS. REGAINING CONTROL OF THE PRISONS WAS ANOTHER ELEMENT IN HIS OVERALL PACIFICATION STRATEGY, HE SAID, AND HE WOULD NEVER PERMIT A RETURN TO THE STATUS QUO ANTE WHERE THE SL TERRORISTS CONTROLLED THE PRISONS AND NOT THE GOVERNMENT.

17. CONTINUING ON THE THEME OF HUMAN RIGHTS IMPROVEMENTS UNDER HIS ADMINISTRATION, PRESIDENT FUJIMORI COMPLIMENTED HIS INTELLIGENCE CHIEF, VLADIMIRO MONTESINOS. HE SAID THAT DUE TO IMPROVED INTELLIGENCE EFFORTS TERRORISTS WERE NOW BEING CAPTURED ALMOST WITHOUT THE NECESSITY OF ARMED FORCE, OR INJURY TO INNOCENT THIRD PARTIES. AS A RESULT, PRESIDENT FUJIMORI SAID HE EXPECTED THAT HUMAN RIGHTS VIOLATIONS "SHOULD DROP SUBSTANTIALLY" IN 1993.

FOLLOWING THE MEETING WITH PRESIDENT FUJIMORI, GENERAL JOULWAN TOLD THEM THE MEETING HAD BEEN VERY FRUITFUL. DURING THE MEETING HE AND THE PRESIDENT HAD HAD A VERY GOOD DISCUSSION ON MUTUAL STEPS TO FIGHT DRUG TRAFFICKING.

19. IN ADDITION, GENERAL JOULWAN SAID HE HAD:

-- CONGRATULATED THE PRESIDENT ON THE VERY POSITIVE STEPS HE HAD TAKEN TOWARD DEMOCRATIZATION AND RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS.

-- COMPLIMENTED THE PRESIDENT ON PERU'S COMMITMENT, AS EXPRESSED BY THE PRESIDENT, TO PROTECT PERUVIAN NATIONAL SOVEREIGNTY AGAINST SUBVERSION BY DRUG TRAFFICKERS.

-- BEEN VERY IMPRESSED BY PRESIDENT FUJIMORI'S DEEP COMMITMENT TO DEMOCRATIZATION, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND DEFEATING DRUG TRAFFICKERS.
